

2013 Titan Robotics Lego League Summer Camp

Thank you for joining us for our 2013 Lego League Summer Camp. This year's game is "Space Race" and students will work to build and program Lego Mindstorm robots that will navigate a field either through a maze or up and over hills and ditches resembling the moon's surface. All students will learn and apply mechanics and programming concepts and work through the design process in a small team environment.

Summer Camp is held in the east end of International School's building (closest to the road). We will put out signs the first days to help you find the entrance. Students need to be signed in and signed out each day. If a student is going to be picked up by someone else other than their parent, please either note this on the following form or send a note with the student and make sure it's noted at check-in.

The Participant identified above ("Participant") desires to participate (as a team member, coach, mentor, judge, or in some other manner) in the *Titan Robotics Club Summer Camp* (the "Programs"). As a condition of allowing Participant to participate in a Program, Titan Robotics Club ("TRC") requires that the Participant (by his or her Parent/Guardian if under 18 years of age) agree to the terms of this Consent and Release Agreement.

1. Participant (and the Parent/Guardian of a Participant under 18 years of age) understands that participation in the Program will expose Participant to risks of injury including, without limitation, injury from: building, lifting, and using electrical/mechanical robots and robot components; using tools; other participants; games played during lunch and other associated activities. Participant (and the Parent/Guardian of a Participant under 18 years of age) understands that TRC does not select, employ, supervise or otherwise exercise authority or control over the coaches, mentors, and other participants in the Program. Participant, if 18 years of age or older, acknowledges and agrees that he/she is primarily responsible for his/her safety. The Parent/Guardian of a Participant under 18 years of age acknowledges and agrees that the Parent/Guardian is primarily responsible for the Participant's safety and that the Parent/Guardian will monitor, as appropriate considering the age of the Participant and other factors, the Participant's participation in the Program.

2. In consideration for TRC allowing the Participant to participate in a Program, Participant (and the parent/Guardian of a Participant under 18 years of age for and on behalf of the Participant and the Parent/Guardian) assumes all risk of such participation and hereby releases TRC and (except as expressly provided below) all of TRC's directors, officers, employees, volunteers, and agents from any and all claims for any injury of any kind to the Participant (and the Parent/Guardian) or other damages that may occur as a result of the Participant's participation in the Program, including without limitation any injuries or other damages that may be caused by the negligence of TRC or negligence of any of TRC's directors, officers, employees, volunteers, or agents (including without limitation negligently failing to adequately investigate or screen coaches, mentors, volunteers, etc.), and agrees not to file any lawsuit or otherwise make any claim against TRC or any of TRC's directors, officers, employees, volunteers, or agents for any such injury or other damages.

Participant (and the Parent/Guardian of a Participant under 18 years of age) understands that photographs, videotapes, and other recordings will be made of participants in the Programs, including the Participant. Participant (and the Parent/Guardian of a Participant under 18 years of age) consents to those photographs, videotapes, and other recordings and unless I check this box , the use thereof (i) as part of a record of the Program and (ii) to promote TRC and the Programs. It is the TRC policy not to print a minor's name with his/her picture without specific permission from his/her parent or guardian, the picture may be used without a name however.

4. TRC strongly believes in confidentiality of all contact information. TRC promises that it will not rent, sell or distribute this contact information to any organization other than those directly involved in the operation and support of TRC programs. TRC will be using the personal contact information provided here as part of its participant database and to contact the TRC participant and/or the participant's guardian as part of its research, program evaluation, or alumni outreach efforts, or other related outreach activities as they may occur. Unless I check this box to remove my consent, I hereby grant to TRC the right to use the personal contact information provided here for TRC's research, program evaluation, alumni efforts and/or other outreach activities.

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Sportsmanship and Behavior Contract

In order to encourage a upbeat, friendly, learning environment for all participants, we ask that you review and sign this document about Sportsmanship. Students work in small teams of 3-5 students with 1-2 mentors coaching the team through both knowledge and collaboration challenges. While part of the day is spent with just their assigned team, there is group work every day and because 4-5 teams work in close proximity in one room, appropriate behavior is essential to everyone's experience during the week.

Behavior that puts students (themselves or others) at risk or behavior that is to the significant detriment of the team will not be tolerated. Below is a brief list of common behavioral issues.

Students are expected to follow all school rules during the summer camp. In particular the following behavior are not allowed

- Offensive or negative comments towards anyone at camp or comments towards materials, facilities etc
- "Rough-Housing" or other excessive physical contact. Only physical contact required should be when multiple hands are on robot. This rule includes any games played during the lunch break.
- Not Respecting Materials-Materials like Mindstorm bricks need to be handled carefully. Students need to only take what they need from kit and return parts to correct bin.
- Intentionally excluding students from activities
- Not being willing to collaborate and compromise with team or camp members.

Titan Robotics operates using a three strike policy and students who reach three strikes are subject to camp expulsion without refund. In order to earn a strike the following process will happen

1. Student is warned about specific behavior, asked to stop and discuss alternative behaviors
2. Student is told warned that they've now repeated the behavior twice and reminded about better alternative behaviors. Parents are contacted and advisor and or mentors discuss solutions to prevent this from reoccurring.
3. If behavior happens again then they earn a strike.

If at any time after step two the mentor, advisor or volunteer feels that the students may harm themselves, teammate or the team, then the student may be dismissed from the meeting and released to their parent's care. If a parent is not available then the student may be asked to sit with a staff member the remainder of the meeting.

I understand how the sportsmanship and three strike policy work and how it will be implemented. I have discussed the expectations and appropriate behaviors with my student and understand any questions they have regarding behavior can answered on the first day of camp. By signing both the student and parent agree to the terms of this contract.
